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## Some useful facts:

Yellowstone: There are no TVs or air conditioning available in any park lodging. Internet service is available for a fee.

Safety precautions: The park rents out bear spray containers for use by visitors, then returnable. When hiking, stay in groups of three to four for maximum safety. Never get between a bear and her cubs.

Yellowstone entrance fees good for seven days from the date of purchase include: private, non-commercial vehicle:\$35;motorcycle or snowmobile:\$30 ndividual (by foot, bicycle, ski, etc.): \$20/person; Senior Lifetime Pass: \$80

Get in For Free:Active military, travelers under 16 years of age, those visiting parks for educational or scientific purposes and disabled visitors get in for free and get a discount on camping.

Don't fit those categories? There are usually six free admission days every year. Check the event calendar for dates. <a href="https://www.nps.gov/yell/index.htm">https://www.nps.gov/yell/index.htm</a>

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Getting there: Fly into Cody, Wyoming, connecting through Denver and Salt Lake City. Then rent a car for the drive to Yellowstone.
